CLINICAL ACTIVITIES

The faculty member supervised 172 students during the summer semester 2008 for the Practicum in Sport and Entertainment Management (SPTE 295) and internship SPTE 495. Student numbers for the summer 2007 - 124 students, summer 2006 - 110

The internship/practicum in Sport and Entertainment Management (SPTE 495/295) involves group and individual meetings with the students to assist in determining the area of sport business they are pursing. Supervision includes individual guidance (if necessary), industry contacts (if necessary) and signing the contract for practicum hours agreed to between the student and the sport industry representative. Supervision also includes on site visits to many of the students. The function of the internship/practicum is essential for the students to obtain a career in sports.

The student is required to complete a journal and practicum paper relating the experiences gained and theoretical lessons applied. It is important to relate the combination of the two because a job in sport business requires hands on experience. The course often influences the student to move forward in the sport selected or adjust his/her emphasis. A great opportunity for the student to acknowledge internal evaluation is essential in career planning.

Finally; the paper and journal are graded and a meeting is held between the faculty member and the student to discuss the grade. The important part is the knowledge and experience gained by the applied experience. We discuss all facets of sport and how it relates to the academic setting at the University of South Carolina.

SPTE 495 – Internship in Sport and Entertainment is the capstone field project for the students. The internship should be the entry level job. The students have to complete a research paper involving an aspect of the sport and entertainment business. The research paper involves a complete literature review and is required to be in APA research format.
